ENTRIES AND CHANGES – Entries submitted prior to the Opening Date will *not* be accepted. Requests for changes or move-ups to your entry must be received in writing or email to the Trial Secretary by November 7, 2024. Day-to-day move-ups will be accepted.

MEASURING - Dogs with a wither height of 20" or less will need show proof of measurement or be measured at the trial, unless they are jumping in the highest jump height in that category/division.

DIRECTIONS TO FACILITY: Take Happy Valley Road, to 15th Avenue, turn north to the second lot on your left, which is enclosed by a block wall. Park in the lot as closely as possible to the other vehicles. DO NOT park outside of the block wall. We will have someone monitoring the parking.

From Phoenix (or Flagstaff) - Take I-17 North (or South) to Happy Valley Road. Go east.

This event will be held outdoors on artificial turf. Ring size is 100 x 100. **No canopies will be allowed to be set up on the artificial turf**. Canopies will be allowed on the DG surface around the turf, and they can be staked there. The parking area is close enough and secure enough that exhibitors may work directly out of their vehicles if desired and weather permitting.

There is no shade and there is **NO WATER** on site so please bring enough for you and your dog(s). Parking and crating areas are available.

No overnight security will be provided however the site has a 6' block wall all around it and the gates will be locked at night. The gates will be locked at approximately one hour after the last run on Saturday, and will be open Saturday and Sunday mornings by 7:00 am. Equipment or personal items left on Show Grounds are the responsibility of each exhibitor.

RV parking is not available on site at all but there are RV parks in the area.

This is tourist season! Owners are responsible for any damage and cleaning up after their dogs. Dogs must not be left unattended in motel rooms. Non-compliance may result in a bench show hearing.

No food vendor on site. We will have pre-packaged snacks available, AND we will be providing lunches to everyone who works. There are several fast food restaurants nearby if you are not comfortable with this arrangement. Due to the small size of this trial, all exhibitors are encouraged to work. We will have a chart for you to fill out at the trial for the classes you would like to work.

Early set up will be Friday afternoon between 3:00 and 5:00 pm.

Gate will open at 7:00 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday.

Check in time is 7:30 to 8:00 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday. If you check in once, you do not need to check in again. Judge's briefing and first walk-thru on Saturday and Sunday at 8:00 a.m. The trial will start at 8:30 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday. Move ups will be allowed Saturday to Sunday. If your dog needs to be measured, measuring will be done from 7:30 – 8:00 a.m. Saturday and Sunday.

Run Order:

Saturday – Gamblers 1 & 2 (EONEON), Regular 1 & 2 (EEOONN), Jumpers 1 & 2 (EEOONN) Sunday – Jumpers 3 & 4 (EEOONN), Gamblers 3 & 4 (EONEON), Regular 3 & 4 (EEOONN) Saturday we will run tall to small, Sunday we will run small to tall.

Toys will be allowed for training in the ring and run at the end of their jump height. See the ASCA Agility rulebook for more information.

Agility obstacles will include: Dog Walk (slatless with granular rubber surfacing), A-Frame (slatless with granular rubber surfacing @ 5 feet), Teeter Totter with granular rubber surfacing, Winged and Non-Winged Jumps, Double Jump, Displaceable Tire, Open Tunnels, and Weave Poles (24" spacing).

FEO (For Exhibition Only) – We will accept FEO entries. Dogs entering FEO must be a minimum of 15months of age. FEO entries may jump at a lower height, but are not eligible for any prizes or awards. Any dog under 18-months must jump at a lower height. No points towards titles will be earned in this division.



HIT Rosettes Requirements:

HIT calculations are based on scores from Jumpers/Gamblers/Regular. HIT Level determined at level the dog was entered in Regular class. Points for HIT are calculated as follows: Elite Q - 7 pts, Open Q - 6 pts, Novice Q - 5 pts. Each faulted Q run in Regular shall be given one-half the value of the equivalent level HIT Q points. In the event of a tie, dog with the fastest combined YPS from the Regular class will be the winner. Dogs in the ACE program will be included in the calculations. There will NOT be separate HIT awards for dogs in the ACE program. Dogs in the ACE program are still eligible for HIT awards. Same rules apply.

- All ASCA agility trials are open to purebred and mixed breed dogs.
- Dogs do not have to have an ASCA registration or QTtracking number to participate in an ASCA agility trial.
- If your dog is an ASCA registered Australian Shepherd, fill in your dog's ASCA registration number where designated on the entry form.
- If your dog is not an ASCA registered Australian Shepherd and you would like to earn ASCA titles, you need to obtain an ASCA QTracking number for your dog. Any dog is eligible to get an ASCA QTracking number (not just Australian Shepherds). Once you have an ASCA QTracking number, use it as your dog's ASCA Registration Number. The ASCA Service Membership and QTracking Number Form can be obtained at the ASCA website (www.asca.org) under "Forms" and will also be available at the trial.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

This trial will be held under the current rules and regulations of ASCA®. Exhibitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of ASCA® rules and regulations, and agree to abide by all rules in effect at the time of this trial.

- If your dog is an ASCA registered Australian Shepherd, fill in your dog's registration number where indicated on the entry form. If your dog is not an ASCA registered Australian Shepherd you will need to obtain an ASCA QTracking number for your *dog IF you wish to have any qualifying scores applied towards titles*. Once you have an ASCA QTracking number, use it as your dog's "ASCA Registration Number" on all entry forms. You can find that form at https://asca.org/wp-content/uploads/2022/06/qtsvcapp.pdf. Dogs may compete at the 24" jump height if desired but will be scored with the 20+ dogs.
- Current Jump Height Table, Breed Exemption List, description of classes, levels, and divisions are included in the current Exhibitors Handbook.
- A copy of the current Exhibitors Handbook may be downloaded free from the ASCA website: www.asca.org.
- Bitches in heat, lame or blind dogs are ineligible for entry, as is any dog with a deformity which may cause a judge to not be able to reasonably assess the dog's ability to function and perform agility obstacles safely, and in a manner that is in the best interest, health and welfare of the dog.
- Any dog which demonstrates aggression towards any person or any dog, whether inside the ring or outside the ring must be excused from the agility trial. Any dog which the judge feels is not in enough control to perform all obstacles in a safe manner will be excused from the agility trial.
- This trial is open to any dog at least eighteen months of age, including purebred and non-purebred.
- Junior Handlers are encouraged and will receive a discount on all junior handler classes entered.
- No leads, collars, food, toys, or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course or within 20 feet of the ring entrance.
 The only exception to this rule is leading your dog on leash to the start, and then handing the leash to a ring steward.
- All dogs must be on leash when not competing in the ring, and must be contained unless being prepared to run.
 Safety shall always be of foremost consideration in actions and conduct by the handler at all times.
- The organizing committee may refuse any entry on the basis expressly provided through ASCA rules and regulations or guidelines established by ASCA Board of Directors. Anyone not currently in good standing with ASCA will not be allowed entry into the trial.
- No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, acts of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.
- There shall be no refunds for entries in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of the reason for such dismissal.
- A withdrawal from the trial after closing date due to an injury and/or illness to the dog will be eligible for a refund up to 75% of the total entry fee paid. A veterinarian's notice of injury or illness will be required for a refund. Bitches which come in season after the closing date will be eligible for a refund up to 75% of the total entry fee paid. A veterinarian's notice is required.
- It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the organizing committee, be asked to leave the trial site. In such cases, no fees shall be refunded.
- There will be a \$20 service fee charge for any returned check. Checks not honored by the bank do not constitute a valid entry.
 All crates and exercise pens are to be set up only in designated areas. Each exhibitor is responsible for cleaning up his own
- All dogs must show in the height class they entered unless measured into a higher jump height class by the judge. Dogs that

 measure into a higher height class will run at the end of the running order for that height class or for exhibition only in the lower
 height class.
- All handlers for a given class should be present at ringside at least 30 minutes prior to the start of scheduled classes for walk through and briefing. Any dog and handler not present when called shall be ineligible to run.
- Any dog that fouls the ring more than once will be excused from the remainder of the competition for that day.
- Practicing on the equipment in the trial area is absolutely prohibited at all times, other than the use of the warm-up equipment
 as stipulated by ASCA guidelines governing trials. Any exhibitor practicing on the equipment will be barred from future ASC of
 AZ events.
- No alcoholic beverages or illicit substances are permitted on the grounds at an ASC of AZ event. Violators will be prosecuted to the full extent of the law and barred from entry as a spectator or participant at future ASC of AZ events.
- Poor sportsmanship will <u>NOT</u> be tolerated. If anyone exhibits poor sportsmanship (i.e., yells at, curses at, harasses, etc.) any
 volunteer or competitor, he/she will forfeit their entries for the rest of the show weekend, and will be asked to immediately
 leave the show grounds and any incidents will be reported to ASCA.

AGREEMENT

IMPORTANT LEGAL AGREEMENT-(1) The person signing this Agreement represents being authorized to enter into it on behalf of him/herself, as well as (if different) the owner(s) and handler(s) of the dog(s) for which an entry form is being submitted (all these parties collectively referred to herein as "Applicant"). (2) "Releasees" here collectively refers to the Australian Shepherd Club of America® (ASCA®); its officers and board of directors, staff, contractors, insurers, attorneys, and agents; as well as ASCA®'s affiliate clubs and each of their members, officers, directors, employees, show chairs, show committees, judges, contractors, insurers, and agents. (3) Applicant enters into this Agreement in consideration for being allowed to submit an entry form and, if approved, to take part in related activities of ASCA® and/or its affiliates. (4) Applicant acknowledges entering into this Agreement voluntarily, after the opportunity to obtain independent legal review of it and to have questions about its likely meaning answered through such review. (5) Applicant accepts the terms of this Agreement not only on his/her own behalf but also for his/her successors, assigns, beneficiaries, heirs, parents/quardians, and anyone else who might raise a claim on his/her behalf or as a result of her suffering harm. (6) To the extent any provision or application of this Agreement turns out to be unenforceable, the rest of it still remains fully effective. (7) This Agreement is to be interpreted under Texas law, without application of its choice-of-law rules, and-to the extent permitted by law-any legal action by Applicant that names Releasees as one or more defendants shall be filed and heard solely in the state or federal courts serving the county of ASCA®'s headquarters: Brazos County, Texas. (8) Applicant agrees to abide by the rules and regulations of ASCA® and any other rules and regulations appearing in the premium for this event. (9) Applicant represents that the dog(s) being entered is/are not known to pose a hazard to persons, other dogs, or property and that all required rabies and other vaccinations under the state and local law of the dog's state of residence are current. (10) Applicant acknowledges awareness of and assumes the risk associated with his/her participation and that of his/her dog(s) in this event and related activities, among which are personal injury to Applicant and those affiliated with Applicant, injury to Applicant's dog(s), and damage to Applicant's property. As but a few examples, Applicant and/or his/her dog(s) may be injured from the condition of (or failure to warn of the condition of) floors, stairways, lighting, security measures or a lack of them, electrical devices, fittings, show rings, parking areas, motor vehicles, and unfamiliar animals and people. (11) Applicant releases Releasees from any claim or liability whatsoever arising from any injury, harm, liability, or demand in anyway said to occur during or in connection with related events, also waiving any right to assert such claims that he/she otherwise might have in the absence of this Agreement. (12) Applicant also agrees to indemnify Releasees from any claim that Applicant or those acting on Applicant's behalf, for Applicant's benefit, or in Applicant's place, might assert against Releasees. The obligation in this regard extends even to Applicant's paying settlements, judgments, and expenses and costs of legal defense incurred by Releasees. (13) The waivers, releases, and promises of indemnification undertaken by Applicant in this Agreement EXTEND EVEN TO: CLAIMS ASSERTING NEGLIGENCE PER SE. CONDUCT THAT IS INTENTIONAL OR RECKLESS. CLAIMS OF FRAUD, CLAIMS INVOLVING DEATH, ACTIVITY THAT WOULD OVERLAP WITH ALLEGATIONS OF CRIMINALITY, AND/OR CLAIMS SEEKING EXEMPLARY DAMAGES. They apply without regard to the basis of the claim (e.g., based on tort, breach of contract, common law, implied or express warranty, or otherwise). Applicant's promised indemnification of Releasees also extends to claims third parties assert against Releasees said to be based on Applicant's conduct. (14) INFECTIOUS DISEASE-Applicant's promises and assumption of risks in this Agreement also extend to the risk and any asserted harm Applicant and the dog(s) may suffer from actual or threatened exposure to infectious disease, whether COVID-19 or otherwise, and Applicant accepts full responsibility for taking such measures as may be required or prudent to protect Applicant and well as other participants in the events. Applicant represents being aware of related recommend health practices, e.g., masking and distancing. (15) Applicant assigns to ASCA® the sole right to pursue any claim in connection with or arising in relation to the scheduled events that Applicant or those acting for Applicant otherwise might assert against any person or entity affiliated with ASCA®. (16) There are no provisions to this Agreement other than as spelled out here and they may not be modified except by formal ASCA® board action. This Agreement is to be interpreted to provide Releasees with the maximum protection from liability allowable under the law.
